Ravenswood Business District/Four Corners Specific Plan Update Draft Subsequent Environmental Impact Report

Background and Purpose of Errata

The Draft Subsequent Environmental Impact Report (Draft SEIR) for the Ravenswood Business District/Four Corners Specific Plan Update (Specific Plan Update) was published for public review on July 26, 2024. The public review period ended on September 10, 2024. A Final SEIR, which included formal responses to public comments received on the Draft SEIR and text revisions to the Draft SEIR, was published for public review on November 18, 2024.

The following text revisions are minor clarifications regarding Tribal Cultural Resources Policy LU-7.13 to note other possible measures could be implemented in addition to preserving in place any tribal cultural resources inadvertently encountered during construction to reduce impacts to a less than significant level. As a result, the text revisions shown below do not require recirculation of the SEIR under CEQA Guidelines Section 15088.5 as they clarify the full range of measures available, consistent with Archaeological Resources Policy LU-7.9 also presented in the SEIR, to ensure resources encountered during construction are appropriately treated.

Draft SEIR Text Revisions

The below text includes revisions to the Specific Plan Update Draft SEIR. Revised or new language is <u>underlined</u>. All deletions are shown with a line through the text.

Pages 397-398 **REVISE** the following text in the first sub-bullet point under Policy LU-7.13:

Policy LU-7.13: If the City determines a project has a potential to cause a substantial
adverse change to a tribal cultural resources identified through project-specific AB 52
consultation, and measures are not otherwise identified in the consultation process
required under PRC Section 21080.3.2, the project applicant shall implement the following

measures to address site specific impacts to avoid or minimize potentially significant impacts:

• Avoidance and preservation of the identified tribal cultural resource(s) in place, including but not limited to: planning and construction to avoid the resource(s) and protect the cultural and natural context, or planning greenspace, parks, or other open space, to incorporate the resource(s) with culturally appropriate protection and management criteria The Professional Archaeologist shall recommend mitigation measures to mitigate to a less than significant impact in accordance with California Public Resources Code Section 15064.5. Tribal cultural resources shall be evaluated with the assistance of Native American tribes and/or individual tribal members who have previously been contacted and responded to outreach efforts made by the City of East Palo Alto. Mitigation measures may include, but would not be limited to, avoidance, preservation inplace, recordation, additional archaeological testing, and data recovery.
